# Compactor Cleaning

Contracted with Atkins and the first initial cleaning. The cleaning will be the first week of the month, nine months out of the year.

## **IDA** Conference

The conference was great and attended presentation including bike friendly businesses and apps. Our new website will be optimized for mobile. The office is also be looking at commonly used apps and train businesses on how to make the most of them.

# **City Report**

SEC is working on a comprehensive revised street closure application. It will go to the CID board December 10<sup>th</sup>, introduced to Council December 6<sup>th</sup> with the final read January 6<sup>th</sup> to be in place for calendar year 2014. The SEC has addressed the issues presented in the letter to council from the CID Board sent in 2011. After discussion, Rhodes stated that the SEC will take a look at the 80% of signatures required that is on the application.

#### **Solid Waste District**

Eastside Tavern is appealing their status as medium restaurant. After discussion, King motioned to recommend to the city that Eastside be reclassified as a small restaurant, Wagner seconded and none were opposed.

Looking to improve the dumpster by Bank of America by getting rid of the fence and placing a compactor with a transformer next to it. The money would come out of the Solid Waste District Fund. The discussion for need of more compactors and dumpsters was discussed. Population is increasing but there are limited spaces where they can go. Property owners would need to allow compactors to be placed on their property.

#### **Street Closure**

The application for street closures will be coming to the CID board in December for review. It will include a definition of special event. The first read at city council will be December 16<sup>th</sup> and the vote will be January 6<sup>th</sup>.

# **Internal Policies**

Eleven policies were discussed regarding street closures including: requiring event organizers post signs on street barricades that let customer know that businesses on the street are open, all applications must be submitted to the city's Special Event Committee and must be received by the city's deadline. After discussion, King motioned to recommend that the CID board approve the internal policies, Waigandt seconded and none were opposed.

Recycle Pilot Project

The bins have all been installed on 9<sup>th</sup> Street. The City will be monitoring th comingling. Additional stickers will be added on the bins.

## Trash Cans

The City does not refurbish trashcans. Now we need to look at either re-powder coating the old trashcans or buy new ones? It was suggested possibly just replacing the lids.

#### Compactor/Dumpster Cleaning

We will have one more cleaning before the winter months. We will resend out a newsletter to businesses reminded them where all of the compactors/dumpsters are because some of them have moved around. Will also remind of fines for not disposing of trash properly.

# Cigarette Litter/Smokers Stations

It is a test project with all 8 stations being adopted. The businesses will maintain, secure and track how well they are working. If it works well, there may be some funding options for more. The backpack vacuum cleaner has been purchased and works well.

#### Free WiFi

The numbers are currently being run for the project and will be able to use the information to see if it is something to continue. After discussion regarding, costs, number of users and effectiveness McClung motioned to recommend to the Board that the pilot run thru January to give the Operations Committee time to make a decision. Wade seconded and none were opposed. Gartner stated that she will prepare the numbers of what it would cost to run the entire system as well as the numbers from the 6 month pilot to review.

#### **Delivery Trucks**

Gartner is asking everyone to take problem pictures of delivery trucks to get a better sense of the problem. Things to keep in mind would be size of trucks, time of day, location, length of stay and days of the week. This will add into the report put toget by Sam from the last meeting. This information will help set to scope and define goals.
